PARENT INFORMATION - INSTRUMENTAL PROGRAM

The ability to play a musical instrument is a skill that can be enjoyed throughout a lifetime. Your child is eligible to begin the instrumental program at this time. If you are interested in having your child participate in band, please read the following explanation of the program.

1. INSTRUMENTAL DEMONSTRATION FOR GRADE 4 & 5 STUDENTS

Your children will attend an instrumental music demonstration during their weekly music class. This year should your child wish to learn a musical instrument and become a member of the school band, lessons and rehearsals will be offered after school.

The following information will answer most of the questions parents ask each year. Please read through the following material to learn about this very exciting opportunity.

2. Information/Registration for Instrumental Lessons Ms. Chaplin, Instrumental Instructor

<u>Tuesday, September 17th</u> – at Heron Pond Instrumental Program - Information Night for Parents 7:00 PM –All 4th & 5th Grade Parents of Interested Students

Information explaining the program, rental procedures, and suggestions for a successful year in band will be sent home with students after the instrumental demos (by September 13th)

Students should return the registration/signup form no later than **Friday, September 20th, 2019**. Handbooks and forms will be available at the meeting on September 17th. Parents may also register their student at the Open House session. Lessons will start the week of October 1st.

A brief meeting will be held for parents to hear about the instrumental program from Ms. Chaplin. Vendors <u>WILL NOT be present</u> at this information session.

Please make every effort to attend this very important session. If you cannot attend, and your student will be participating in band please call **603 233-6256** if you have any questions or need any additional information.

If students are using their own instruments, books and supplies will be available for purchase through Ms. Chaplin at school. A list of commonly used supplies is included in this handbook on page three.

Personal instruments may need to be repaired. Appointments can be arranged with Mrs. Chaplin to have instruments checked free of charge. Please call the band phone number to make an appointment for a check up before <u>September 24th</u>. (603 233-6256).

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. When will the program begin? The first week of scheduled lessons for ALL 4th and 5th grade students will start during the week of October 1st. The music lessons are free to Milford students in Grades 4 & 5. Your child should come to his/her first lesson prepared with his/her instrument, book, and <u>a pencil</u>. Each student will be given a notice with his/her day and lesson time. Lesson times will also be posted in your child's classroom and sent in an email from <u>cjc.musicsound@gmail.com</u>. Students who have not received an instrument by their first lesson should still come to class. Late signups are accepted, and notices may not go out until September 29th.

2. What type of lesson will my child have? Your child will have a weekly small group lesson scheduled after the school day sometime between 3:15 & 7:30. More detail is found on p.11. Lessons will focus on playing skills and performing in small groups. Students will be grouped by like instruments in most situations. Occasionally students are grouped by instrument families (woodwind, brass, percussion, violin). Specific information about lessons will be available to all second year students once they have registered for the program.

3. What instruments are available for my child to play? The instruments offered for beginning 4th and 5th grade students are: violin, flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone, and mallet percussion/snare drum kit. Returning 5th grade band students desiring to play other instruments should speak with Ms. Chaplin. Students who already take private lessons on piano or guitar are also welcome to play in the band.

Violin will be offered to 4th and 5th grade students. Those students who played violin last year will be in a separate, second year group. First year violin class is held on Friday after school unless there are enough students for more lesson groups. Students who sign up will be in a class with only violins and will perform at a concert.

4. What do we do to get an instrument? There are many choices to use in providing an instrument for your son/daughter. There are several music stores in the area as well as stores on the internet. These vendors offer both new and used instruments for sale. Renting is a great option for not investing a large sum of money to start with. Families may also own instruments that students are welcome to use. No matter where the instrument comes from, it needs to be in playable condition for the student to have an enjoyable and musically educational experience. There are instruments available to be loaned out thru Ms. Chaplin for students who otherwise could not afford to participate. Please indicate you would like a loaner on the registration form.

<u>THE CHOICE OF THE RENTAL COMPANY IS YOURS.</u> You may choose from any vendor. If you are getting an instrument from a retailer you can't visit, please be aware of ease of playing and the general condition of the instrument you are purchasing. Also be sure to check the warranties, minimum specs, durability, and repair guidelines. Please feel free to make an appointment with Ms. Chaplin to have instruments other than rentals inspected during after school hours. You may drop it off during school. Any instrument checks need to be arranged before September 24th.

5. Which music book does my child need? Grade 4 & 5 students will be using "<u>Tradition of Excellence</u>", <u>Book 1 by Bruce Pearson</u>. This book may be purchased at local music stores or through Ms. Chaplin at your child's music lesson. Please purchase the correct book for the instrument your child is playing. Violin students will be using "<u>String Basics</u>" by Terry Shade. Getting the book at the same time when you pick up the instrument is a good idea.

6. What about practicing at home? Practicing is the key to your child's success. A beginner should practice 15 minutes twice a day and work up to 30 consecutive minutes or more every day. A regular practice time is suggested and students will be required to keep a record of his/her practice. Many students will need to develop a routine to follow during each practice session. A sample chart for this can be found in the back of the parent handbook.

Progress Reports - Progress reports are sent home three times during the year. These are not grades but an evaluation of how your child is progressing with their instrument. Students will receive a PD, P, or NI grade for each category. Students are asked to share these with their parents.

7. Will my child perform in a concert? All students will participate in a performance during the school year. These dates will be announced at a later time. Students who participate in lessons will be expected to participate in all activities unless prior arrangements are made with Ms. Chaplin. Fourth graders will perform music for their instrument as well as small ensemble music. Fifth grade students will have the opportunity to play several times during the year at various school events. Information about performances, groups and dates will be made available at a later time. For the past two years both the 4th and 5th grade bands were invited to play in an All District concert with the middle and high school bands.

- 9. Recommended Brands: Check for manufacturing specifications. Certain retail/foreign made brands have only limited warranties/or not supported by available repair locations. Parts, durability, and ease of playing for beginners should be considered. (Additional information, page six.)
- 10. Pick up and drop off Students can stay at the stage until picked up by a parent or guardian at Door D1 (next to the café).

3:15 -5:00 lesson students should stay after school. They will be supervised on stage.

5:00 until end of day students should go home and then return in time to attend their lesson.

Please feel free to ask questions during this discussion, other parents will have the same questions! Please leave sign up forms of any students not already signed up or those who may have changed their choice of instrument. This is very important so they will be assigned to the right lesson group.

If you have personal instruments you want to have checked for general playing condition, have your child bring them to school to have a free maintenance and playing condition checkup. Most repairs are minor and there is a small charge to cover the cost of materials. Other more serious repairs might need to have a certified instrument repairman deal with the instrument individually as needed.

Helpful Hints:

Welcome to the 4th & 5th Grade Instrumental Program. The following information will try and answer many questions for those students who have never played an instrument before and parents who are new to the program.

All students must have an <u>instrument & book</u> to use for lessons. If you do not own an instrument, they are available to be rented through local area music stores. A limited number of larger instruments (trombones/baritones) are available to be borrowed from the school. There are instruments available to borrow if there is a financial situation keeping your child from participating. If your child wants to use a school instrument, please have them speak with Ms.Chaplin during the school day or indicate this on the registration form. You may also contact me via email or band phone number. Drums are not available to be borrowed. Students are always required to supply the recommended accessories such as reeds, cork grease, valve oil, & cleaning cloths mentioned in the rental guide and a lesson book. At this time students are also responsible for providing the lesson book..

DRUM INFO: All drummers must supply drumsticks, book, and a practice pad and bring these to each lesson. Drum students who are renting, should rent a percussion kit (snare & bells). We will be working on drum and mallet technique so having a percussion kit (includes both snare drum & bells) would be useful. Students who already own a drum or drum set, may rent just the bell kit. Drummers should ask for size 5A drum sticks. It doesn't matter if they have plastic or wood tips. Practice pads come in different sizes and styles. The pad most frequently used is called a Gladstone pad. It's black rubber, 14" in diameter and will sit on top of any drum. If you rent a drum, it should come equipped with snare drum, sticks, drum key, drum stand, practice pad and a case with wheels. Ask to rent a percussion combo kit. Drummers should purchase the <u>Combination Percussion</u> book. This has both drum and bell music in it.

Places to go for instruments and music

The book we will be using is <u>**Traditions of Excellence**</u> by Bruce Pearson - <u>Book 1</u>, available at most music stores for both first and second year students. This book may also be ordered through Ms. Chaplin and at Amazon.com.

Please be careful of purchasing instruments over the Internet. Instruments should have minimum quality specifications, a warranty for repairs, and be easily played and on pitch for beginners. If you have any questions about this feel free to call Ms. Chaplin and discuss any concerns or questions. QUALITY, DURABILITY and EASE OF PLAYING are a must have. 5

All students should have an instrument and the book for their instrument and grade level. They should bring a folder to keep music in, and a pencil. If you have any other questions please feel free to speak with Ms. Chaplin.

Lessons will be starting October 1st. Your child's lesson day and time will be posted in their classroom by Friday, September 27th. Lessons will be held once a week and students will be able to perform as a group at the end of the year. 5th grade band students will have a chance to perform several times throughout the year and be part of a school performing group at different events. <u>Which brand of instrument should we get?</u> <u>RECOMMENDED BRANDS – INFORMATION:</u>

Listed below are many manufacturers of instruments which are considered to be quality musical instruments. They are easily played by beginners, come with warrantees and can be repaired when needed. These instruments are recognized by music educators, instrument repair technicians, and the music industry as brands best suited for a positive learning situation.

Playing a musical instrument can be a lifelong vocation or hobby. Renting to purchase or buying an instrument should be considered as an investment. The less expensive instrument is not always a good choice since these bargain instruments usually do not play easily or on pitch. There may be problems with playing them in tune and repairs are usually needed more often. When repairs are needed, the instrument might not come with a warranty. Many of these instruments can't be fixed because music dealers and instrument repair people will not work on them once they do need repairs. Many times they can't get the parts necessary to repair them.

All instruments should come with a case, cleaning accessories specifically for each instrument, and items such as 2-3 reeds, and cork grease or valve oil which will need to be purchased from time to time as these items will be used up during playing. All drum students should have an instrument or practice pad, as well as drum sticks, bell mallets, a drum key, and a practice pad. Drum sticks should be a professional brand. Drum sticks from video game sets are not appropriate. If there are any questions about other brands please feel free to ask questions.

Which brand of instrument should we get?

& mallets, practice pad, drum key, wire music stand for bell set, and a wheeled case.
<u>Drum Sticks</u>: Vic Firth, Zildjian, Pro Mark, Vater, Silver Fox, Regal Tip
No synthetic or metal drum sticks can be used for class. No video game sticks.
<u>Practice Pads</u>: Gladstone, Ludwig, Pearl, Remo, Real Feel, Slingerland, Vic Firth
These are rubber disks that fit on top of a snare drum or a pad which

may or may not be mounted on a stand.

BUS INFORMATION: How will the instrument get to school?

The bus company will allow all instruments on the buses with the exception of combo percussion kits, (drum/bells) and baritone horns. This was a policy which was put into effect several years ago. If your child has an afternoon lesson they are allowed to stay after school and wait on the stage. They will be supervised. Please speak with your child's bus driver for specific situations. Please keep in mind any child who may need assistance loading or unloading their instrument. If the bus your child takes is exceptionally crowded, or if your child has a larger instrument, these students may need to be driven to school. The larger instruments may also be driven to school and dropped off before the child's lesson if it is more convenient. Students must not open their instruments at the bus stop or on the busses. Parts become lost, and sometimes broken, and often left behind. Also, students should not attempt to play their instrument at the bus stop or on the bus or in any moving vehicle for safety reasons. All instrument cases and books should have the students' name, grade, and building on them before the first lesson. Please have them keep the instrument in the case until their first lesson unless there is someone who can help them while practicing at home.

I am looking forward to an exciting year with both the 4th and 5th grade students. Thank you for helping to get your child started or continuing to play an instrument.

Lesson Schedule Information - Survey for Parents

To help assist in scheduling lessons this year it would be greatly appreciated if you can answer the following questions. Lessons start after school at 3:15 and continue in consecutive 30 minute periods until 7:30 pm. The last lesson is scheduled at 6:45 or 7:00pm.

Due to after school schedules involving many varied activities, lessons will be scheduled with this in mind. Parents should list times when their child **is** available, please do not fill out asking for one day and time (i.e. sports conflict or scouts for instance). Parents may pick their child up after their lesson at Heron Pond at a convenient time, any time before 5:00 pm. Otherwise students can choose an evening lesson time after 5:00 pm and be dropped off and picked up by a parent. Band students will always use Door D1 for drop off and pickup.
